Houston, Tex., Attorney Tyrone Moncriffe Elected to Board of Directors of National Criminal Defense Bar Assn.

Washington, DC (Aug. 24, 2011) – Houston, Tex., attorney Tyrone Moncriffe was elected to the Board of Directors of the National Association of Criminal Defense Lawyers (NACDL) at the Association's 53rd Annual Meeting in Denver, Colo., on Aug 6. Moncriffe has given numerous lectures to both the NACDL and the Travis County Defense Lawyer's Association (TCDLA).

An experienced criminal defense attorney and past Director of TCDLA, Moncriffe lectures extensively subjects such as voir dire, direct/cross examination, and the psychology of storytelling in trial law. He has taught as a faculty member at both the Criminal Law Institute in Huntsville, Tex., given by TCDLA and the Criminal Law Institute in Plano, Tex., and regularly speaks at the University of Houston and Texas Southern University to young lawyers on developing communication and trial skills.

Moncriffe received his B.A. from Texas Southern University in 1978 and his J.D. from Thurgood Marshall School of Law in 1982.
